With a great interest in sound design and sonic texture, he creates bespoke sounds, music and atmospheres for the projects he works on. Recent compositional credits include Lines and PodPLAY for Theatre Republic, and Limit by Sophia Simmons, directed by Shannon Rush (State Theatre Company Umbrella production). He also writes and produces music for children's theatre, such as Camp Quality's cancer-awareness puppet show, The Big Score, and musical theatre for kids such as The Magical Egg by Lucinda Cawrse.

Currently James is working on Barbaros, a dance production by Lina Limosani, Weight by Jasmine McWatters and Precious Things by Temeka Lawlor.

Although the majority of the soundtracks he produces are electronic in nature, James has an enormous passion for piano, and starts most of his composition work there. For productions such as Jon Halpin's Middletown at AC Arts, or Casey Vansible's Lake's Angel, he has composed piano scores, with supporting electronic backing. For Corey McMahn's Earthquakes in London, James wrote a piano overture that was converted into a score for a live orchestra.

From the horror-like sounds of Richard II at AC Arts, the relentless and aggressive percussion of Lines, to the soft and magical sounds of The Magical Egg or the bizarre and wonky soundtrack for Toaster Dog in Dream World by Rory Williams, James enjoys working with a huge range of styles and sounds.
